PLEASE REMEMBER ... WE ARE NOW IN TIER 2 SOME OF THESE RESTRICTIONS ARE NEW

- You must still wear a face covering in church unless medically exempt.
- We are still asked, with your permission, to keep records of who attends worship for Track & Trace.

Public worship in Tier 2 is permitted as an organised gathering provided any person attending is:

- alone, or
- part of group all from the same household, or
- from two linked households, or
- part of group all from the same linked Christmas households (23 – 27 Dec only) and

You must not join any other group, or mingle with any person from another group.

NB non-household groups of 6 are not permitted.

We are confident those attending public worship will comply with the Tier 2 regulations – but we also very much hope and pray you will, as this is the only way we can keep our worship as Covid-secure as possible and keep our churches open for worship. Please do keep in mind the strict 'no mingling' regulation – I know how tricky this may feel but we have to be scrupulous about it through these winter months. But spring is coming, praise God!
