A Season of Remembrance



'Flesh of her flesh they were, spirit of her spirit, Fallen in the cause of the free.' (Laurence Binyon)

As we enter our season of remembrance, we find ourselves in the desperately sad position of having witnessed a whole new chapter in the tragic story of lives lost in war. The image of 109 empty prams in the centre of Lviv in March, there to recall the number of children who had died by that point, turned out to

be only the beginning of a terrible conflict in which so many Ukrainians and Russians have been killed. As we gather in our churches this year, to remember the names of the fallen, and those whose names we do not know, there is a special poignancy with which we recommit ourselves to the pursuit of peace. Together, we seek out ways to be instruments of the peace which comes from the heart of Christ. Whether at home or in church, may this prayer (which is part of the Remembrance liturgy) grow in our hearts and the hearts of those who have the means to end conflict, wherever it is found:

O God of truth and justice,

we hold before you those whose memory we cherish, and those whose names we will never know. Help us to lift our eyes above the torment of this broken world, and grant us the grace to pray for those who wish us harm. As we honour the past, may we put our faith in your future; for you are the source of life and hope, now and for ever. Amen.
